ED Report

Nov 23rd, 2022 – Odd Squad Productions – Annual General Meeting
Covering the Fiscal Year – **Sept 2021 to Sept 2022**

Dear Board Members and OSP Members:

Our year in review for 2021/2022 is documented below in note form for your review. We had another busy and productive year and have continued to evolve and develop our youth prevention and educational programs to suit a changing world.

We have been supported generously by our individual and corporate sponsors, and were able to meet our fundraising goals with the help of some important fundraising events: the 25th Anniversary Gala at the Hotel Vancouver on Jun 16th 2022 to a sold-out audience of 550 guests – special thanks to OSP Business Development Manager Gerry Zipursky and company for overseeing this very successful event and Marilou Appleby for Chairing; and the WinABarracuda raffle with the support of Angie Kalhar, Tanjit Kalhar and KTL Transport (providing OSP the car for raffle and help generate some needed-funding for OSP). We also hosted an Odd Xmas party at the Hollywood Theatre and these events combined help us make our budgetary goals as well as re-connecting with our individual and our corporate supporters!

Thanks to each of the OSP Board members for their donation of time, experience, and guidance to keep this organization running. The OSP Executive Team with led by our President Dr. Bill MacEwan has dedicated significant time to the oversight of this organization. Despite Dr. MacEwan's incredibly busy schedule, he is still firmly at the rudder and we enjoy seeing him on site at Odd Squad with his hands-on leadership style. Rich Robins continues to work on the critically important finances, budgets, and audit oversight of Odd Squad Productions year-after-year, and we are grateful for this. Tom Stamatakis, as Vice President, is able to help oversee the procedural and organizational challenges (despite his demanding work schedule challenges) and we are better for it. New Board member Supt Jenn Keyes has brought her legal acumen into the organization in a number of different ways and is helping draft our HR policies and has also provided support for a new film component for OSP on Indigenous Elder/Knowledge Keeper advice to a younger law enforcement generation. Executive Team member John Daly has stepped up and will drive forward with an organized Fundraising Committee, helping align our budget goals with our fundraising capabilities; Dave Rebic continues to guide the operational support for Facility work and improvement and assist with the annual Golf Fundraiser; and Rob Rothwell has supported and assisted with important initiatives like the Barracuda Raffle (appraisal and marketing work) and participated in our reorganization workshop. Our other Board members have given up their time and expertise to help Odd Squad continue on our educational mission for youth – and we appreciate all the efforts from the music talents of our legendary Blues Board member Jim Byrnes to the support from Howard Blank on fundraising events, Theresa Campbell on critically-important video educational projects for schools, to the donations, help and support from the other Board members we greatly appreciate your service for Odd Squad Productions!



Our Odd Squad Team continues the critically important gang and drug education work of Odd Squad with a significant contribution of personal time and volunteerism – so thank you all for helping here. And a special vote of appreciation for all the volunteers behind the scenes helping us deliver our programs. We have had parents advise us that it is precisely this environment that has motivated them to engage their youth with Odd Squad: a sense of family, a place to develop resilience and strength for life, and an organization that puts an emphasis on volunteerism and what that service provides for youth.

We look forward to another busy and productive year. Thank you for your ongoing support and stay tuned for our upcoming events. We will not be hosting an Odd Xmas party this year due to competing demands for projects, but will deliver an email campaign to donate to OSP in lieu of attending this fundraising event. Our youth programs on site at the OSP Headquarters in Burnaby are running 6 days a week, and we have an open-door policy for visits, so feel free to drop by and say hi!

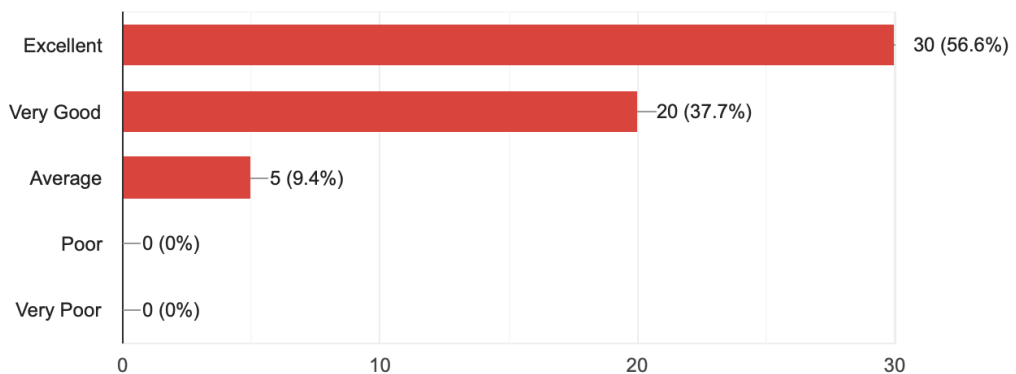


Drug Awareness Presentations: Over the past year, OSP member Cst. Dave Steverding has provided drug education presentations to hundreds of students in the Lower Mainland using reality-based footage, interviews with experts, drug users, and drug traffickers. These presentations are vetted by our educational experts to ensure the message being delivered is prepared with consideration for the audience and the with learning aims and outcomes on drugs and addiction. At Odd Squad we believe that prevention programs for youth are the best long-term solution for the drug problem!

Nov 29th – Cst. Dave Steverding is out at Collingwood Schools as a multiple drug education presentation for youth on the North Shore! After several presentations, the feedback was 93% of the students surveyed rated the presentation as Good or Very Good!

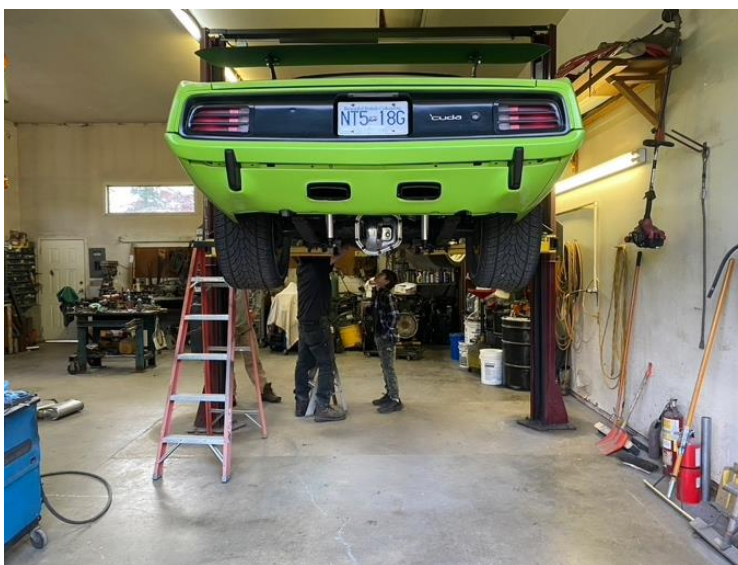

An Update from OSP Member Mark Steinkampf - *In August, I completed the peer-to-peer program that the Diamond Foundation funded. Due to COVID issues, it was a modified version of what we had initially envisioned, and it was a success. The feedback from the students was very positive and the supervisor from the Jewish Community Centre was happy with the delivery, methods, and program.*

CFO grant – Fentanyl Modules for online Educational Learning

All three modules have been updated and are in the final stages of film lock. I reached out to our friend Doug Rogers, who is a Drug and Alcohol Counsellor in Vernon and Melanie Jorgensen, and Indigenous Teacher, also from Vernon. They re-crafted the facilitators guide for module one and two and added indigenous material to them. Melanie is currently working on module three and hopes to have it completed shortly. Melanie Jorgensen is very enthused about the three modules and has volunteered to facilitate them with Indigenous Youth in the Vernon area.

Peer to Peer Update:

One high school is back online for our Peer based education program. This will be slightly different as the educational walks in the DTES are not proceeding due to safety and public disorder issues. On the positive side, we have a great facility to run a day-long program now! The first school will commit to 15 students to attend which will include presentations, self defense, and a trip to Volken Academy. This is a new program and this will be the Pilot. It will happen in February of this year.

OSP OUTDOOR WILDERNESS - August 1-5th, Board member Jenn Keyes and her husband Ret. Sgt. Al Kuniss provided their cabin and acreage at Birkenhead Lake and helped Odd Squad deliver its first outdoor wilderness camp for 8 youth. This was funded with support and help from Dr. Rene Georges Abi-Rached and the Vancouver Rotary Club. Special thanks to Brian Shipper for preparing equipment, S/Cst Chin-I Hsiang for running the physical training every day of the camp, Jenn Keyes for organizing the groceries and food, Al Kuniss for assisting with everything including the community service wood chopping at Birken while there and Mark Steinkampf for helping with the camp! 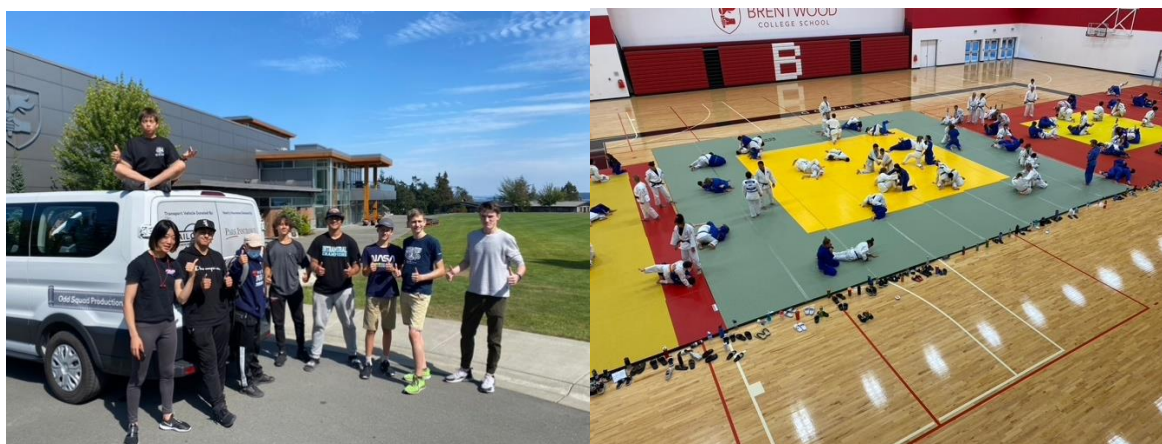

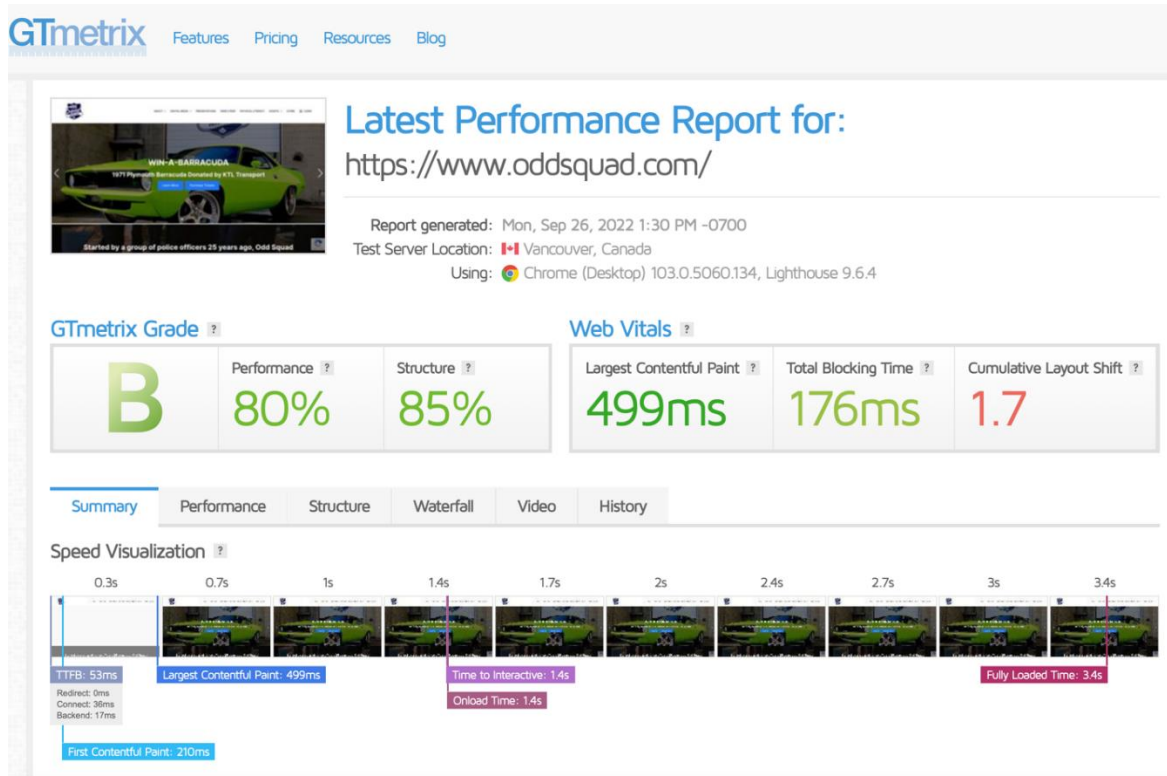
AUGUST 2022 – MILESTONE!

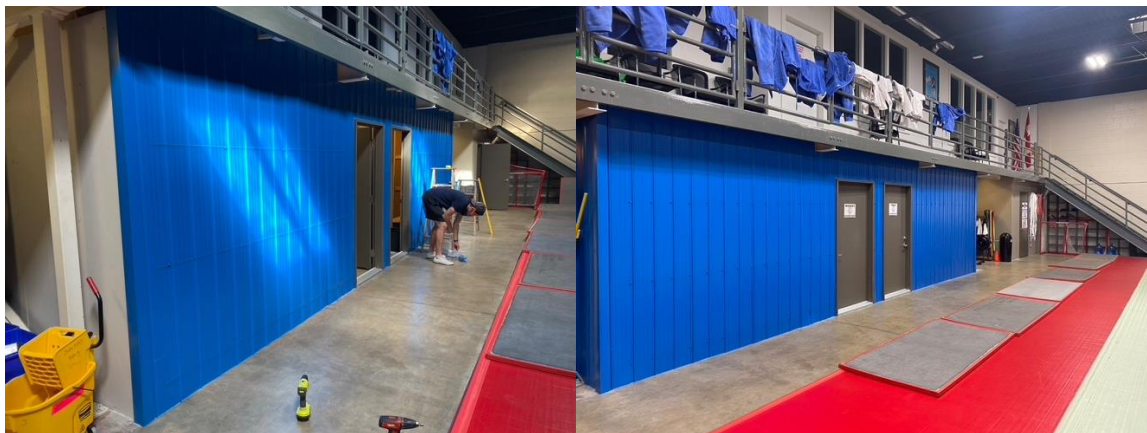

Physical Literacy Registrations has been revamped and simplified for the user. This has greatly assisted in bringing in program fees for the Physical Literacy programs for 2022/2023.

- *Kitchen lights rewired to LED*
- *Changerooms on separate electrical circuit*
- *1000 watt sound system installed and hooked up – grant from Cindy – work by Brendon et al to instal*
- *Railing and overhead storage space for tool room – railing and structure supplied by Railcraft*
- *22' drop down screen for training hall in – needs to be installed – projector to follow – grant from Cindy's work*
- *Professional wrestling weigh scale in for youth programs*
- *Lot and yard cleanup done on numerous work days over summer – Brian overseeing volunteers – community service for neighbours*
- *Patio blocks in for back yard area – Cindy's help to achieve this from son's company (donation) – Brian/Toby will instal*
- *Doors, trim and paint for facility looked after with volunteers by Brian*
- *Equipment and storage room organization by Brian and volunteers on multiple work days over summer*
- *Retaping of training floor mats (and regluing) organized by Brian and summer students over multiple days*
- *Cladding for changerooms (thanks to Dave Rebic for organizing – son Ben Rebic for helping along with Brian and Chris)*
- *New kitchen Island for food preparation donated by Jenn Keyes and Al Kuniss – Brian coordinating fix up of kitchen – utilized daily to feed volunteers*

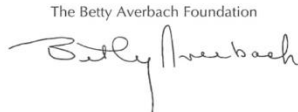
