COCAINE

is a powerfully addictive stimulant drug made from the leaves of the coca plant native to South America. As a street drug, cocaine looks like a fine, white, crystal powder. Street dealers often mix it with things like cornstarch, talcum powder, or flour to increase profits. They may also mix it with other drugs like Fentanyl.

HEART ATTACK

failure of the pumping action of the heart, resulting in loss of consciousness and absence of pulse and breathing: a medical emergency requiring immediate resuscitative treatment

FENTANYL

a synthetic opiate drug which is a powerful painkiller and tranquillizer

CRYSTAL METH

a concentrated and highly potent methamphetamine with dangerous side effects used medically in the form of crystalline hydrochloride and often used illicitly

PSYCHOSIS

a severe mental disorder in which thoughts and emotions are so impaired that contact is lost with external reality

HEROIN

a white, odourless, bitter crystalline compound that is derived from morphine and is a highly addictive narcotic

Addiction

the condition of being habitually or compulsively occupied with or involved in something and continuing its use despite negative consequences

Opiates

Prescription opioids are medications primarily used to treat acute and chronic pain

Detox

a treatment that is intended to remove poisonous or harmful substances from your body

Оху

short for oxycodone; a synthetic analgesic drug that is similar to morphine in its effects and subject to abuse and addiction

_____ is a registered not-for-profit charitable organization, created in 1997 by seven Vancouver City Police Officers to empower youth to make positive life choices about drug use and criminal behaviour through educational material as well as documentaries - **Odd Squad**

_ a time of intense difficulty or danger – Crisis

is a pure, potent form of heroin originating in Southeast Asia - China White

is a synthetic drug that alters mood and perception (awareness of surrounding objects and conditions). It is chemically similar to both stimulants and hallucinogens, producing feelings of increased energy, pleasure, emotional warmth, and distorted sensory and time perception. – **Ecstasy**

an ultra-potent synthetic opioid, 100 times more potent than Fentanyl, not approved for use in humans in any capacity – **Carfentanil**

Module 1 - Sequence 4 - Vocabulary Exercise

a type of medication known as tranquilizers. Familiar names include Valium and Xanax. They are some of the most commonly prescribed medications in the United States. When people without prescriptions obtain and take these drugs for their sedating effects, use turns into abuse **– Benzodiazepines**

Hallucinogens are a diverse group of drugs that alter perception (awareness of surrounding objects and conditions), thoughts, and feelings. They cause hallucinations, or sensations and images that seem real though they are not. – **Hallucinogens**

a chemical substance that acts primarily upon the central nervous system where it alters brain function, resulting in temporary changes in perception, mood, consciousness and behaviour - **Psychoactive Drug**

any of the various chemical constituents (such as THC or cannabinol) of cannabis or marijuana – **Cannabinoids**

synonymous with Narcan - Naloxone

_____. is a medication that blocks the effects of opioids (such as heroin, morphine, Fentanyl, etc.) that can be used to temporarily reverse an opioid overdose - **Narcan**

related to drugs, Dr. Marvin Krank defines it as "a compulsive preoccupation with the drug, thinking about the drug, trying to obtain the drug ..." – **Addiction**

a notice of a death, especially in a newspaper, typically including a brief biography of the deceased person – **Obituary**

a place where the preparation of illegal substances takes place - Clandestine Lab

the quality, relative degree, or specific degree of being toxic or poisonous - Toxicity

the experience of negative physical and emotional symptoms due to withdrawal from drugs - Dope Sick

Xylazine-

is a non-opioid veterinary tranquilizer not approved for human use, has been linked to an increasing number of overdose deaths nationwide in the evolving drug addiction and overdose crisis.¹ Studies show people exposed to xylazine often knowingly or unknowingly used it in combination with other drugs, particularly illicit fentanyl.

Module 2 – Sequence 4 – Vocabulary Exercise

Refers to the dried leaves, flowers, stems and seeds from the Cannabis sativa or Cannabis indica plant. The plant contains the mind-altering chemical THC and other similar compounds – **Marijuana**

is a cocaine hydrochloride (powder) that is mixed with different ingredients, mainly baking soda, to make a purified and potent form of the drug that is smoked rather than snorted. It is considered highly and rapidly addictive. – **Crack**

RECOVERY- *a* process of change through which individuals improve their health and wellness, live a selfdirected life and strive to reach their full potential.
